Over 27 years later, I have accumulated a large box full. Now, we are downsizing and they must go. It is has been humbling to read through them before they are dumped, and makes me realise

again, how good it is to be thanked, and to thank others. Expressing thanks builds our relationships with one another. Taking time to say thank you, shows we do not take others for granted. Such appreciation builds our character in a very attractive way of openness and joy – no-one likes a surly, meanspirited person. Saying "thank you" is good for the soul.

I love how the Bible narrative about Jesus is full of 'ring of truth' accounts of His humanity, including appreciating being thanked. In the story of Him healing 10 men with leprosy, only one returns to say thank you. Jesus



# THE HUT AND THE READING ROOM

Update on behalf of the Trustees of The Hut, the Trustees of the Reading Room and the partners of Dorking Medical Practice. and to check the assumptions on which the plans are founded. Their initial report is expected before the end of May.

When I last updated the village on the plan to provide a new village hall/community centre and a doctors' surgery, we were awaiting the outcome of the geo-technical survey at the Hut site in Furlong Road. We now have that, and there are no indications that the location is subject to soil conditions which would get in the way of being able to build on the site in the way intended.

If the indications from the development consultants are that the project looks deliverable, the trustees of the Reading Room and of the Hut will push the launch button on the merger process for their two charities. That process will take at least until the autumn and be somewhat dependent on Covid restrictions allowing public meetings to be held to consult with the residents of Westcott.

The trustees of the Reading Room and of the Hut are therefore minded to begin the formal process required by the Charity Commission to merge their two charities so as to allow the assets of both charities to be committed towards delivering a 'next generation and beyond' set of community facilities for Westcott.

Please look out for a further update on this in the July edition of this magazine. The Joint Working Party hopes to have a stand at WESTfest on Sunday, 18 July which, with luck, will show some indicative schematics for the village hall/community centre and surgery buildings on the Furlong Road site.

There is little point in merging unless the proposals are financially viable. The Reading Room trustees have therefore appointed a well-reputed firm of development consultants to test the likely values and funding requirements of this ambitious project



Dear Resident,

There are two important events during June in the WVA calendar.

The first is that we will be holding this year's AGM on Thursday 24th June at 7.45pm.

We have made the decision to hold this at **Holy Trinity Church** as we have in previous years, and we will make every effort to ensure people feel Covid-safe. The Agenda and meeting details will be emailed 14 days ahead of the meeting.

We would like to take this opportunity to set out the things which have been achieved over this somewhat strange year, driven by members of the Committee, all of whom are Trustees of the WVA, and all of whom give their time and talents voluntarily.

 With Holy Trinity Church, set up and ran the Good Neighbour scheme during the Covid-19 pandemic, helping residents with shopping, collecting prescriptions, cooking meals, and providing support to vulnerable and isolated individuals.

• Purchased and installed in the former BT phone box on the corner of St John's Road and The Burrell a second defibrillator for the village.



• Purchased the Christmas Tree on the village Green and the "green" solar powered lights to decorate it. (Special thanks also go to the Westcott



Gardeners club for their donation and to the children and staff at Surrey Hills All Saints Primary School for making the decorations).

- Sponsored the Secret Santa competition for the best lights decorating houses in the village.
- Delivered Christmas Day lunches to villagers (courtesy of Westcott House).
- Made an application to further restrict parking on the short stretch of Westcott Street between the Village Store and North Street to improve road safety. This will however be subject to

consultation when the application is considered by Highways.

- Set up and recruited individuals for a "Speed-watch" team.
- Purchased a hand-held radar speed gun, and trained the first group of volunteers.



- Ran a children's competition (with prizes) to design Dog Poo posters as a light-hearted way of getting the message through to the small minority of dog owners who foul our green spaces and footpaths.
- Purchased and erected more formal signs about Dog Fouling when the problem got significantly worse during lock-down. We are also urging the



District Council to adopt the Green Dog Walkers scheme to reinforce the messabout dog fouling.

- Funded the purchase of 5 computers in order to ensure that no child in the Surrey Hills All Saints Primary School was disadvantaged by not having access to technology.
- Worked with Surrey County Council and the Surrey Hills AONB to ensure the Leith Hill Greenway is made safe at the A25 crossing point between Balchins Lane and The Rookery where the excessive speeds of motorists on the main road pose a danger to users.
- Monitored all Planning Applications in Westcott to ensure that building projects were in line with the Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan.
- Continued to lobby the District and County Councils on noise pollution from motorbikes which plague this area especially during the summer months.

The second thing is that 1st June is the time when the WVA normally asks residents to renew their membership subscription for the coming year - £10 per household, or a larger amount if you can afford it. This year however we are proposing (subject to AGM approval) that all residents become members of the WVA with voting rights at meetings, and that in the future we will simply ask for donations to the Village Association in order that it can continue the work done on your


# THE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR WRITES...



#### **Local Elections**

A big thank you to everyone that took the opportunity to support candidates at the May local elections. Every candidate, irrespective of political party, puts a lot into the election period and public scrutiny that comes with standing for election. Each vote cast overall makes that worthwhile and is an endorsement of local community democracy.

I have had many local residents feedback to me that they were impressed at the smooth operation of our village Polling Stations with the COVID secure arrangements working well. Thank you to everyone who made that happen successfully.



Overall, there was no change in the political make-up at Pippbrook. The

turnout in the District Council election in Westcott was the second highest of all those held on 6th May at just over 50%. Thank you to everyone who voted for me – I look forward to helping people across our village until the next elections in 2023.

That year will see boundary changes across the district and every seat on the District Council will be re-elected in one go. The council is likely to have switched to different boundaries with wards of around 5,500 voters each, compared to the 1,800 we have in Westcott today.

To achieve that number for us, Westcott could join up with part of Dorking or with neighbouring villages. All that will be decided by the Boundary Commission for England at the start of 2022 based on submissions from us all. Please do let me know what you think would be the best configuration.

# THE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR WRITES... (cont.)

In recent weeks we have had a fox visiting our garden. Generally, it is great to see all forms of wildlife around and to let nature take its own course. In this instance though, our visitor took to staking out our two pet rabbits in their run and so some human intervention was required.



At the time of writing, two main measures have been employed. The hutch has been given an extra layer of security with a series of locks and catches re-used from a collection inherited from our children's great grandfather and an electric fence has been installed around the run.

It all makes us think again about precisely which human actions are the right ones to take. Should nature have been left to take its course, and presumably some fox cubs fed by their mother? Should rabbits have never been domesticated to provide company, friendship and the well established mental health and wellbeing impacts that appropriate pet ownership has for humans? Should the fox be encouraged to prey on other wild rabbits instead?

There are no easy answers to any of the above. Just life there are no really easy answers to our other challenges on how our actions impact the environment. All we can do is to minimise what we do and to save resources for the future generations.

There are a range of ideas as to how you can play your part in this challenge on the Mole Valley District Council website – please do check it out if you haven't already explored it.

Why not make summer 2021 the time when you make just one change to lessen your impact on nature? Plant a tree; walk somewhere rather than drive; pay extra attention to your recycling weighing your residual rubbish fortnightly to see if you are throwing away less – the ideas are endless but our natural resources are not.

# **Considerate Parking**

In recent weeks the subject of car parking etiquette has been high on my inbox list.

When we created the Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan, there was clear evidence that there was a lack of car parking spaces in the village and a clear policy was included setting out the minimum numbers of parking spaces to be included in new developments. This policy has been

upheld by the planning inspectorate in the years that have followed.



Although, through that policy, we have some control over future arrangements, at present there remains a balance to be struck to help each other out.

Recognising that, as with driving more slowly through our village, best practice starts with our own behaviours and then hopefully visitors will follow suit, I have been asked to repeat a few simple best practice things to do locally:

- Please don't park on pavements as this can prevent those with mobility issues from being able to safely get around
- Avoid parking in front of driveways and junctions
- Please leave others space to pull out and to open car boots so that, for example, those with young children don't have to compromise safety when getting them into the car
- When coming and going late at night or early in the morning, please keep noise to a minimum

The redevelopment at the Hut site in Furlong Road promises to bring with it some much needed additional car parking capacity in due course and that will be immensely welcomed.

In the meantime, perhaps we can help each other in one more way too. Especially in the world of more working from home and of people trying to use their cars less often, if you happen to have a driveway or even garage that you don't use for whatever reason, then would you be prepared to let someone else in the village make use of it to reduce the overall demand for on-street parking? If so please do let me know and I would be happy to introduce you to folks in need.

#### Clarion Update

Housing Association Clarion have given the council an update on the state of their local housing stock across the district:

- 1,561 homes currently pass all assessed aspects of the required housing standard.
- 360 homes cannot pass the standard even with bespoke investment, and alternative development plans need to be made for these properties.
- 2,514 homes can pass the standard, with additional investment beyond which is currently scheduled.
- £9.4m is already scheduled including the following estimated as (but is subject to technical assessments):
  - £7.5m Energy Efficiency improvements
  - £0.8m new door entry systems
  - £1m remodelling to address space and storage limitations







### WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



Westcott local history group was founded in 1998 to promote interest in the history of Westcott by convening group meetings with visiting speakers, and arranging walks and visits. Terry Wooden, one of our founders, was the driving force in building our archive of photographs, maps, documents, and registers relating to Westcott Parish. Our website westcotthistory.org.uk continues to be expanded through digitalisation of these records.

A subscriber on the Facebook Group, Westcott Memories, sought information recently on Rokefield and its use as a Blind Home so here is a history extract from our archives starting from about 1860 to the present day:-

An earlier Village Mag article (Apr 2019) told how the Rookery Estate in Westcott was bought in 1768 by Richard Fuller (1713-782) of the Banking family, from Daniel Malthus (1730-1800) who had developed it from being a 'fishing and game lodge' with the mill pond supplied with water by the Pippbrook. Richard Fuller's heirs continued to live at The Rookery for 126 years. When Richard Fuller's son Richard died in 1852 his widow Maria (nee Barclay but no relation to the other Westcott Barclays) inherited the estate but was obliged to vacate the family home to make way for her brother-in-law George Arthur Fuller

and his large family. She did not wish to leave Westcott so the family built a new house called Rokefield on part of the estate.

The Fuller family estate included all the land west of the Westcott Street and in particular a plot of 28 acres called Hole Hill farmed by a number of tenants including Mr Balchin. A part of this was 10 acres called Rokefield. In 1854 a Court Baron listed this part of the estate as inherited by Maria Fuller. The actual construction date of the new house is uncertain but was between 1854 and the time of the 1871 census, where it is shown with a full complement of 8 domestic staff. Maria Fuller had two sisters Julia and Emily. All were born at Cadogan Place, Chelsea and their father was G.P.Barclay, a London merchant living at Charter House Sauare, Middlesex, Her mother Maria was born in Leatherhead.

They must have been an extremely well off family, as the 1881 census shows that Rokefield domestic staff numbered 10 people and the Rokefield laundry was in Westcott Street at the Old Barracks where William Ruffell, the coach man, lived. The Rokefield property included a paddock extending south to the Pippbrook stream. It had stabling for 6 horses, a coach house, a pleasure garden with two summer houses and an orangery with a vinery, greenhouses, and a gardener's cottage. There

are memorial stones to the three sisters in Holy Trinity churchyard. Their most lasting memorial is the Westcott Reading Room and Draycote house where the caretaker lived. They also left an endowment for the future upkeep of the Reading Room for the benefit of the village. Maria Fuller died on 6 Oct 1892 shortly after her sister Emily, who died on 7 July 1892 aged 74. The third sister died on 26 Feb 1898 aged 82. The plaque can still be seen in Draycote's garden.

The Rokefield property was auctioned in May 1898 on behalf of 15 individuals. The Dorking Advertiser reported that bidding rose to £6000 and was subsequently purchased by Lt. Colonel Jasper Davies, RE retired, and Henrietta his wife. The 1901 census records them in residence with five staff but a few months later the house was sold again, on 12 July 1901, to Charles Carey Druce of The Elms, Westcott for £8,500.

The Druces supported village charities especially those with a musical interest and held many events for Westcott villagers in the Rokefield gardens. In the parish church there is a stained

glass window, dedicated to St Cecilia, the patron saint of music, which was installed as a memorial to Mrs Carey Druce.

In 1946 Rokefield was bought by the Jewish Blind Society, a charity founded in 1814 for the welfare of Jewish Blind people in London. It was extended to accommodate 64 blind residents and a new hospital wing was built in 1950. The blind residents participated successfully in the Westcott Arts & Crafts Exhibitions. In 1990 the Jewish Blind Society amalgamated with the Jewish Welfare Board and the Rokefield property was sold to the Gardeners Royal Benevolent Society

who required a temporary residence while their home in Henfield, Sussex was being rebuilt.

Following this, much of the extensive grounds and agricultural area was sold and the remainder was developed by Rushmon Homes. The original house was retained but turned into apartments and several new houses were built in the grounds. Part of the paddock near the Pippbrook on the southern boundary was also sold and a few houses including the doctor's surgery were built thereon and known as the Riverbank.



### DORKING MUSEUM



Well, here we are in June and hopefully summer is well and truly with us. June 21st represents the first day of astronomical summer and the summer solstice. But, at the time of writing, that date is also scheduled as the 'end of lockdown' and, for many, an even greater cause for celebration. Somewhat confusingly, June 24th is Midsummer's Day, which was one of the most popular and keenly-observed festivals throughout the early modern period, marked by rural communities with Morris dancing,



processions, latenight drinking, the blessing of crops and the ritual banishment of devils and other

unwelcome sprites (a tradition that might be followed again this year – substitute 'viruses' for 'devils').

The Museum is open: Assuming that the roadmap is on course, the Museum was able to re-open on May 20th, after an extensive covid-19 assessment and implementation of special measures. Great care was taken to ensure that it could open safely whilst continuing to offer an appropriate visitor experience. This does mean that, subject to further relaxation, normal covid procedures are observed, visitor numbers may be restricted and there is no access to interactive elements of some of the displays. The normal adult admission charges apply, but children admitted free.

#### Volunteers' Week:

The Museum is run entirely by volunteers. While some were able to continue working



'behind the scenes' during lockdown, many were not because their roles are visitor-facing or depend on the building being open. They have been incredibly pleased to be able to return to greet and help our visitors after a long lockdown. The invaluable contribution of volunteers in all aspects of society has become more greatly appreciated, of course, during the pandemic. Appropriately, June 1st-7th is Volunteers' Week, an annual celebration of the contribution millions of people make across the UK through volunteering. This is a time for us to

come together and thank all volunteers for their invaluable contribution.





Whilst we all feel at times that phones get in the way of real interaction, I have a couple of suggestions that you can share with your family on a walk that can actually bring you together or even become a nature collection competition.

**SEEK** 

Found a mushroom, flower, or bug, and not sure what it is? Open up the Seek camera to see if it knows!



Drawing from millions of wildlife observations on iNaturalist, Seek identifies from your phone camera and shows you lists of commonly recorded insects, birds, plants, amphibians, and more in your area. Add different species to your observations and learn all about them in the process! The more observations you make, the more badges you'll earn!

No registration is involved, and no

user data is collected. Seek will ask permission to turn on location services, but your location is obscured to respect your privacy while still allowing species suggestions from your general area. Your precise location is never stored in the app or sent to iNaturalist.

#### **BirdNET**

Have you ever heard a bird sound you couldn't identify?



Learn how to use the BirdNET smartphone app to identify your mystery birds. It's so easy, you press a button to record the birdsong, then press to 'Analyse' it and in seconds it tells you what the bird is.

These are great apps for families who want to spend more time exploring nature together or for anyone who wants to learn more about the things they see and hear out on their walks.

### TOOLS WITH A MISSION



Some 15 years ago I turned out the garden shed and found that I had two pickaxes. I was never going to wield one pickaxe again - let alone two. A friend told me about Tools With a Mission (TWAM) and that the closest collector was in Farnham. I mde the 60 mile round trip with the pickaxes and was told about the life changing work that TWAM does in developing countries. Then I was told that there was an area between Farnham and Carshalton where there was no collector (it only needs a dry shed or garage) so I volunteered to become one, little realising the huge volume of tools that would pass through my garage once the fact was advertised!
