What a time to be a Virologist! At the beginning of the coronavirus pandemic everything changed so fast, it seemed surreal. Suddenly, friends and family were calling me about recipes for hand sanitiser (... does gin work?!) and the latest 'virus' news headline.

Now, nearly two years later, how are you faring? I saw a quote that 'we are all in the same storm. but in different boats'. Life is tough right now,

but it's tough in different ways for each of us. We have had to live in isolation or perhaps found ourselves in unexpected household groups. We have depended on the kindness of family, friends and neighbours. We have a new appreciation for NHS and service industry workers. We have had to master technology,

even my 80-something Dad (... although there was that video call when he inadvertently activated the Charlie Chaplin filter and couldn't turn it off). We have found new ways of connecting - from Zoom Church to virtual meetings at the kitchen table.

At the beginning of the pandemic, virologists like myself all felt an urgency to step up. I am sure it was similar for health care workers. As a scientist, work was helpful in some ways, in giving me a sense of purpose. But then the impact of

personal circumstances would break through and I thought of people, including my friends and neighbours in Westcott. who faced different kinds

of anxiety about their health, families and livelihoods and the future. We all know the reality of being unable to meet people, illness or the sudden

coronavirus was almost miraculous, and the result of an extraordinary collective effort. For me, after many years working on novel vaccine technologies, being vaccinated myself with a newly developed vaccine was a strangely emotional experience. It gives us a new hope for the future.

Sometimes, I find myself grumpily wishing that things would 'get back to normal'. But at the beginning of

a new year, I am instead hoping for a 'new normal' - that we can all have a greater appreciation of what is really important. May we seek to understand the different ways in which others have experienced the storms of the past 2 years. May we see the world become a kinder place and remember that, in the words of St Paul: "And now these three remain: faith, hope and love." (1 Corinthians 13:13)



THE HUT & THE READING ROOM

Update on behalf of the Trustees of the Reading Room, and of the Hut

There is not much to report this month, other than to issue a gentle reminder of the Public Open Meeting to be held on 22 February 2022. Notice of such meeting was given in the January edition of this magazine and is repeated in this edition.

The explanation which I gave in my last update for the reasons why this meeting needs to be held can be found at www.westcottvillagehall.com, where you will also find further background information and guidance on how to make your views on this matter heard.

Do please get in touch with the trustees if you have any questions or concerns. The only question which has come to my attention so far is why the process proposed to be adopted is called a 'Cy-près' scheme. The term is taken from Norman French, and means 'as close as'. Hence it is used to describe a permission by the Charity Commission granted where the original intentions behind one charity, in this case the charitable trust in which the beneficial title to the Reading Room land is vested, can be better carried out by another charity, here The Hut charity which enjoys more flexibility in how it deals with its land assets.

The trustees look forward to seeing you at the Reading Room at 8pm on 22 February 2022.




Keep Safe


Just before Christmas we were well above the England average (from www.gov.uk):

A huge thank you to all my NHS colleagues, and other key workers, that are keeping us going through all this.

It's impossible to describe how our hospital emergency departments work, how it feels to be working on a ward or intensive care unit, unless you've experienced it first hand. Sometimes it feels like tomorrow will never come, but it does and they are there again for another shift for us and our families.

The main thing we can do to help them, is to get vaccinated. If you are unfortunate enough to require hospital care through covid, if you have been vaccinated you will probably be home within 100 hours without an intensive care stay; if you are not vaccinated you are more

likely to require intensive care with an uncertain outcome.

Needing intensive care usually means that someone who was waiting for urgent surgery, like a cancer or cardiac surgery patient, is less likely to be able to have their planned operation. Sadly, four people from Mole Valley lost their lives to COVID during December.

I'm pleased to say that the last two weeks have seen another one in nine Westcott, Ockley and Capel people get their third vaccine. The service at the Beare Green walk in centre is truly excellent – plenty of parking, well organised and in and out within 15 minutes was our family experience.

Keeping Your Voice Heard

The District Council Democratic Services team have recently summarised the proportion of properties for which electoral returns have been completed by polling district following the annual canvas update.

Both Westcott areas are in the top half of the sixty polling stations District with across the around 97.5% completeness. That still means though that there are around 25 properties where residents are not on the register currently. Did you know that the District Council has a policy of taking Council Tax non-payers to Court?



Latest figures show that one in thirty were taken to court last year. From April 2022, if this applies to you then the charges to cover the court costs are rising too – up to £107.50p.

Do You Want To Save Some Money?

February is usually a quiet month for the Westcott 100 Club as we prepare for our next draw and Annual General Meeting in March. Fear not though – it is not too late to join us if you would like a chance of winning the prizes in our five draws each year. We hold draws every quarter in March, June, September and December, with an annual draw – and a bigger prize – in December. Since launching in 2015, club members have won nearly £5,500 in prizes and we have donated over £9,000 to local good causes.

Sounds interesting. Please tell me more. How can I win a prize? How can I apply for a grant?

We are very glad you asked.

To be entered into the prize draws, simply join us by setting up a Standing Order for £25 per number per year. Your number(s) will be entered into the four quarterly and one annual draw. Prize values are based on the number of numbers in the draw – the more numbers, the bigger the prizes – a genuine winwin! New Year's Day Walk and a Look Back at Westcott Personalities

The Walk on New Year's Day this year attracted an enthusiastic group of 40 odd people and dogs led by Chris Dale over familiar territory ending at The Barn on Westcott Heath where John & Maureen Clachan dispensed mulled wine and mince pies for all.

Arthur Brooke of the Brooke Bond Tea Company

In 1894 The Rookery changed hands again when it was bought by Arthur Brooke (1845-1918) of the Brooke Bond Tea Company. The son of a tea trader in Ashton under Lyme in Lancashire he was the eldest of 4 sons and 4 daughters of Charles and Jane Brooke who were in the business of wholesaling tea in shops in northern towns.

At the age of 19 his father put him into the cotton importing trade in London but this trade faded with the American civil war so he was taken into a Liverpool branch of Peek Bros & Winch, tea wholesalers. He was so successful at selling Brooke Bond Tea that his father sent him back to London to manage the company branch. However in 1869 his mother, Jane, died and his father was having difficulties so Arthur returned to Manchester and

set up on his own.

He opened his first tea shop in Manchester in 1869 selling tea, coffee and sugar, and by age 30 he was making £5000 per year with shops in many large towns and a warehouse in London. He proclaimed that Brooke Bond was a high quality pure product unlike the blended teas offered by other traders. Arthur was good at advertising and had learnt a few things on a trip to America.

His slogan was "Good tea unites good company, exhilarates the spirit, opens the heart and banishes restraint from conversation and provokes the happiest purposes of social intercourse".



At age 30 Arthur suffered an illness from overworking. By way of recuperation he took a sea voyage to Egypt and on his return he married a sea captain's daughter called Alice Catherine Young and they bought a house in Willesden. In the late 1870's there was a severe

trade depression but he survived by changing his business model and selling wholesale direct to retail grocers. He was a model employer; he pioneered the 8 hour working day, paid higher wages than his competitors and introduced profit sharing in 1891. He later bought a house in Kensington and an estate near Dorking called The Rookery.

In 1892 Brooke Bond became a limited company with a share capital of £150,000 with Arthur as Chairman and Managing Director. In 1899 his eldest son Gerald (1881-1969) joined the management having served time behind the counter in Leeds. The company prospered and Arthur was known as a benevolent entrepreneur. In 1899 he endeared himself to his customers by marking Queen Victoria's 80th birthday by giving a free pound of tea to every customer over 80.

The company was now selling tea in many countries including India and Canada. In 1902 Brooke Bond won the contract to supply tea for the Delhi Durbar, Arthur retired in 1904 and son Gerald took over as MD and sons Rupert and Justin ioined the management of the company with Gerald succeeding his father Chairman in 1910. Arthur enjoyed his later years at his home in The Rookery and died in 1918 aged 73.

over in 1984 by Unilever who owned Liptons Tea. The PG Tips brand had a 23% share of the market and continued with its chimpanzee adverts until 2002. Brooke Bond remains a major brand in India and Pakistan.






I'm Dominic, a landscape and fantasy painter who recently moved into the charming picturesque village of Westcott. Our village has its own

The recital will be an extended one and there will be refreshments afterwards in the Christian Centre.

Ashtead Choral Society is celebrating its 70th anniversary with a performance of Mendelssohn's great oratorio Elijah, which depicts events in the life of the Old Testament prophet through music of great dramatic power. The choir, together with vocal soloists and the Kent Sinfonia, will be conducted by Andrew Storey.

The Jubilee string quartet make their third and final appearance in the series of three quartet concerts presented by the Dorking Concertgoers. They will play an early string quartet by the young Schubert, written to be played together with his father and two brothers in their very musical family home. The concert opens with Haydn's final string quartet, written at the end of his life when he had the energy to complete only two movements, and it closes with Schubert's last quartet, a powerful masterpiece despite the composer's sadly weakened state of health.

The Surrey Philharmonic Orchestra, playing in Leatherhead, will open their programme with Beethoven's overture to Fidelio, his one and only opera. This will be followed by Brahms' monumental first piano concerto with soloist Dominic Degavino and the concert will close with Schubert's fourth symphony, known as the 'Tragic' – it was written when he was only nineteen yet is full of deep personal feeling.

There is also a ballet screening at the Dorking Halls of Romeo and Juliet on Feb 14th.

DORKING MUSEUM





'Never start with an apology' is established guidance but perhaps we might start this month with one. At relatively short notice, Dorking Museum's re-opening after the seasonal break had to be delayed to allow for essential building maintenance work. The Museum's re-opening date had to be quickly rescheduled for 3rd February, without time to amend the date shown in some publications.

Museum Chairman Kathy Atherton explains, "The delay was regrettable, but this work was deemed necessary to protect the fabric of what is an old building. There is a danger that some of the exhibits or artefacts and material stored might otherwise deteriorate over time, but they are important to the area's rich heritage and to keep safe for future generations. Given the added uncertainty of the covid restrictions, it seemed that this was an appropriate time to carry out the work so that we can re-open fully and safely and welcome visitors back in February."

This comes after another 'challenging year' in which the Museum was not permitted to open until the second half

of May. Nevertheless, the 'closed' time was used as productively as could be within the restrictions in place at the time. Extra work went into preparing the special exhibitions for 2021, permanent exhibition areas were revamped, the teams caught up with basic repair and maintenance, restoration, accessioning and cataloguing, extending Museum's upgrading the online presence, and much more besides. We were able to provide support to school and university students during lockdown, as well as continuing family activities with special home activity packs.

All of the Museum's regular activities were relaunched in May, although with minor limitations imposed by covid restrictions. We were able to welcome more than 2,000 visitors to the Museum, took 450 people out on guided walks of Dorking, the Deepdene Trail and Betchworth Castle, and 300 people underground on tours of the South Street Cayes.

Soon after re-opening, the Museum's team was notified that it had been awarded the prestigious Queen's Award for Voluntary Service, with a

special recognition for our support for the community during

Forster and was accompanied by a sAAhort film and book. The 400th anniversary of the Mayflower in 2020 attracted much attention, and, although the special exhibition was held over until 2021, the Museum team had already been involved in interviews, Zoom presentations, short films, co-operation with special groups in the UK and the US, and a book which generated sales in the US as well as locally.

The Museum's special exhibition. 'Darking 1620', opened in September and had an added significance with November representing the 400th anniversary of the first 'Thanksgiving' feast in the colony. It has proved a particularly popular attraction with visitors and has now been extended until May. So there is still plenty of time to come along to the Museum and enjoy a view of life in 'Darking' in 1620 and the story of William Mullins and the Mayflower travellers. The exhibition also features period apparel - including authenticated 17th century shoes found locally – and the tools of Mullins'



trade as a shoemaker. A magnificent cross section model of the *Mayflower*, created as a real labour of love by the Dorking Men's Shed team, is providing endless fascination for visitors and is being retained for permanent display in the Museum.

Reconnecting with life

Adopting an attitude of gratitude and forming deeper connections with the land and within the communities where we live can both enrich our lives and help build local resilience to help adapt to our changing world.



These are themes that run through 'Braiding Sweetgrass' by Robin Wall Kimmerer – which was, without doubt, the most beautiful book that I read last year. At a time when the problems we are facing seem ever more complex, this book offers down-to-earth insights into how we might restore our relationship with nature, informed by indigenous wisdom, scientific knowledge and a love of plants.

'I wonder if much that ails our society stems from the fact that we have allowed ourselves to be cut off from that love of, and from, the land. It is medicine for broken land and empty hearts.' Human activity has disrupted almost 75 per cent of the earth's surface and put one million animal and plant species at risk of extinction (United Nations Environment Programme). In stark contrast, despite making up only around 5% of the global population, indigenous people are the protectors of a staggering 80% of Earth's biodiversity.

The lives of indigenous people are rooted in their relationship with the land. Having lived in the same territories for thousands of years, knowledge has been passed down through generations to form a deep understanding of how to live in balance with the living world – taking just enough for needs while always ensuring that something is given back to the land in return.

Braiding Sweetgrass is filled with insight into practices that can help bring us into a more harmonious relationship with nature. The Earth is our life support system. Recognising



'...while expressing gratitude seems innocent enough, it is a revolutionary idea. In a consumer society, contentment is a radical proposition. Recognising abundance rather than scarcity undermines an economy that thrives by creating unmet desires...'

The impacts of the climate and ecological crisis are becoming ever more evident throughout the world and it is clear that we must turn away from unsustainable consumption of natural resources. We would surely be wise to learn from indigenous perspectives and live in a way that enables life to thrive.

'The Earth gives away for free the power of wind and sun and water'

Harnessing renewable energy and growing food locally are key to creating resilient communities for the future. Planting a garden, says Kimmerer, is one of the best ways to restore our relationship with the land.

'It's a place where if you can't say 'I love you' out loud, you can say it with seeds. And the land will reciprocate, in beans.'

Gratitude not only encourages us to appreciate gifts, but to repay them, thereby helping to grow and strengthen our relationships within the communities where we live.
