





WESTCOTT VILLAGE ASSOCIATION NEWS 🔌





For those of you who attended the AGM you will recognise the theme of this article.

I have lived in the village for nearly 33 years and been Chairman of the Village Association for almost 5 years. During that time, I have watched the village change in a significant number of ways - and not always for the best. At the AGM I spoke about needing to have bigger ambitions for the village, getting involved - particularly younger residents, and seriously considering the future in terms of how the village is governed.

The Village Association was formed nearly 50 years ago and has tried to ensure that village matters are dealt with effectively, but not always succeeding as far as some are concerned. Local Government at County and District levels is continuina to have to deal with cost pressures, and trying to get things done as a Charity (which is what the WVA is) is more and more difficult because we are not treated the same as a Parish Council. We are all unpaid volunteers who do what we do in what spare time we have, and have no authority over anyone - we can influence but not direct.

the In current climate, with more chanaes afoot in local government, it is my strong view that need



greater authority which will only come from becoming a Parish Council - with the legal status to get things done; hold budgets; employ people; and enter into cost effective contracts to get things done in the village which currently either take forever, or don't get done at all, because working out who is responsible for what between County and District councils is not straightforward - getting something as theoretically simple as a 'No Through Road' sign for Parsonage Lane has involved numerous emails and three different departments.

Yes, we would raise money by having an annual surcharge (called a precept) on the local council tax, but this will be graded according to the rateable value of your house so that those who can afford to pay more, pay a higher amount, but the average per household will still be a very modest amount - little more than some spend on a trip to the cinema or taking the kids swimming.

For this we get:

- Properly elected representatives from across the village
- A Parish Clerk whose job it is to ensure what is needed aets done
- · Access to national organisations advising Parish Councils
- · Access to funding and the legal status to use monies generated from the village on the village (CIL monies),
- National funding pots available to local Parishes.

There is a lot to do in order to make includina this change happen ensuring that the whole village has the opportunity to vote on whether or not we make the change. We propose therefore that a working group is formed which will work on gathering information and opinions, communicating the facts about the proposed changes and then working to make it happen. We are particularly keen to engage with the younger generation of villagers, many of whom have recently moved into the village with young families, because it is they who will be the beneficiaries of the changes we make now in the way the village is governed.

This is an opportunity to make a difference to your community, not for those of us who have lived through the last 50-80 good years, but for the younger generation and their children who inherit the future. If you want to make things happen then drop me an

email and we will start the process of making a difference to our village.

Other things to Note:



The Boundary Commission is due to publish its final decision on the Mole Valley Boundary Review on 6th September. We do not expect to see any changes to the proposed Leith Hill ward, or the arrangement whereby three councillors will represent the new ward. Elections will be held in May 2023.

The latest news on the Local Plan can be found on the MVDC website under Future Mole Valley; September and October will see the next steps in the process of approving the Plan.

Village Projects: Time is running out for us to submit village projects to attract funding from various sources. CIL has been mentioned but there is also money available (a pot of £100m!) under "Your fund Surrey". Please put forward ideas for projects you would like pursued to improve the village.

Bank Closures: Barclays and Halifax branches are closing permanently in Dorking from October and November respectively. Handling cash and

Netley Park, Little Kings Wood and Blackheath. Three weeks ago, I moved across to this job from Leith Hill, but I am still involved in a few projects over there whilst we recruit my replacement.

I've been a ranger with the National Trust for 3 years and previously worked for West Sussex County Council as a ranger for around 10 years. I'm mildly obsessed with trees and woodlands which has led me to volunteer in my spare time for the Ancient Tree Forum, organising walks in different parts of Sussex looking at ancient and veteran trees. I also volunteer as a Tree Warden for my local parish council.





One of the most interesting aspects

of this area isn't just the trees and woodlands (Abinger Roughs is home to some real beauties), it's the number of butterflies and array of species that call Denbies Hillside home. one short walk from the office and I can see Chalkhill Blues, Marbled Whites, Skippers, Adonis Blues and more. A real treat!





It's been great to meet some of the people involved in working the land here too. We work closely with the tenant farmers who are doing a great job with the conservation grazing in the meadows.

We also have a superb team of volunteers who will turn their hand to anything to improve and maintain the countryside, from clearing paths and surveying butterflies, to pulling ragwort and installing gates - they are multiskilled people!

Lastly I'll say that if you see me on the hillside or in the woods, be sure to say hi!

Cost of Living – Help is Available

With the cost of living crisis continuing to escalate, the Mole Valley District Council website has a page which lists the range of support available from the government and other parties, in addition to introducing a discretionary grant scheme available to eligible residents.



If you are on a low income or are experiencing a change

in financial circumstances, the Government offer a range of benefits and help to fulfil individual requirements:

- Jobseekers Allowance
- Universal Credit
- Employment Support Allowance
- Child Benefit
- Advice and Guidance on Housing Benefit

The Safe and Secure Grant from Mole Valley District Council (MVDC) supports older or disabled residents on lower income. It helps you with Handy Person type work done to your home to improve safety, promote independence and prevent hospitalisation or assist with discharge from hospital.

£150 Energy Rebate - MVDC paid over £2million to residents and is now focused on ensuring that the council tax accounts of those who don't pay by direct debit and did not apply for a direct payment can be credited as soon as possible.

The Government has provided Mole Valley with just over £235,000 for use as a discretionary scheme to support residents who were not entitled for the energy rebate payment. Those living in Council Tax bands E - H homes and receiving Council Tax Support will be the priority. Payments will be made directly to people who pay by Direct Debit. Anyone else will need to apply online. Eligible residents can apply through the Council website.

support of charitable activities and raising the profile of causes that are close to home.



One such occasion was the progress of the Refugee Tales group at St Martin's Dorking as a group of more than 50 walkers travelled along the Pilgrims Way. On their first night their evening's entertainment included not just inspirational talks from two refugees with different backgrounds but also music and readings.

Anti-Social Behaviour

When I first started as District Councillor for Westcott my postbag was usually dominated by planning and development management concerns. Then from a few years ago, perhaps helped by the adoption of our own Local Neighbourhood Development Plan, those seem to have calmed a little.

The next most frequent topic seemed to be around housing issues - quality of homes, relationships with Clarion and homelessness. At the time I was in the process of establishing Carrie's Home Foundation in memory of Westcott resident Caroline Kalmanovic and with my fellow trustees we were able to work on fundraising and other ideas of support.

It strikes me that now my inbox is more often than not concerned with antisocial behaviour and the impact it is having on the lives of fellow Westcott residents. It is fair to say that often when I get to learn more about the particular issue, the triggers are much more complex than perhaps they first appeared to whoever brought it to my attention and I am hugely grateful for the understanding that neighbours bring, and that which comes from the council officers and NHS professionals, particularly those in our mental health teams.

If you are experiencing anti-social behaviour, you are always able to contact the Council's team via ASB@ molevalley.gov.uk and they will be on hand with first class advice and action where appropriate.

The Birth, Life & Death of the River Mole

In May 2018 Prof Richard Selley provided a most erudite talk on the River Mole's course in the context of the geological development of the Weald and the North Downs. The river system in the UK has come in for some serious criticism for the pollution that is happening up and down the country.

This was well illustrated by numerous slides and clever movies describing how the North Downs were created in geological time. He showed how the flat plate of Wealden clay underlaid by chalk was uplifted to form the North Downs from which the clay was then eroded leaving the chalk exposed.

We learnt that the North Downs were in fact the southern edge of the last ice age. The map from 1762 was the first to show the course of the River Mole above ground from its source in Baldhorns Copse, south of Rusper, from where it runs south and east gathering water from small tributaries. It runs under a Gatwick runway in a culvert, made in 1985, to Sidlow where it starts to flow north towards Brockham. It collects the Pipp Brook at Pixham and flows through the North Downs Gap between Ranmore and Box Hill continuing up to East Molesey near Hampton Court where it joins the Thames, having run some 80 km in all.

Earlier maps indicated that 'the river goeth underground'. Much of its route lies on impermeable Wealden clay south of the North Downs and London clay north of the Downs, which is the reason why the river responds rapidly to heavy rainfall.

Nowadays the Mole is reported to have the greatest diversity of fish species of any English river but this was not always the case. Between Brockham and Leatherhead the river bed changes from impermeable Wealden clay to permeable chalk and the increased gradient allows the water table to drop below the river bed. This allows water to escape from the river through swallow holes in the chalk bed and banks, thus reducing the volume of

water in the river. Aerial photos show a line of green patches in the fields between Pixham and Mickleham which are the relict swallow holes where the underground water comes to the surface. Water from Mickleham Bends follows a chalky underground course coming up in Fetcham Ponds, which have never been known to dry up. This was described in Brayley's History of Surrey in 1868.

The origin of the name is attributed to the Latin Mola (mill) because there were 20 mills on the river in 1086 according to the Domesday Book. Another possibility is a derivation from Y Melyn – river of mills or the word Molesey (Mul's island). For geologists the alluvial river terraces which have been created as the river passes through the North Downs are

of interest. A clue to the original water table is evident in the Dorking South Street caves where black lines from the limonite deposits indicate possible water levels.

Prof Selley emphasised that in general it was necessary to understand that the west side of the country was gently rising while the East side was subsiding into the North Sea. This is well illustrated by the figures for the Thames Barrier closings to prevent flooding in London and the increased erosion on parts of the East coast. Since the Thames



Barrier was built in 1983 it was closed 4 times in the 1980's, 35 times in the 1990's, 75 times in the 2000's and by 2018, 52 times in the 2010's – in total 166 times to date. This latter statistic is not a good omen for the idea of a grand airport being built in the Thames Estuary land area.

Cradhurst Recreation Ground



We need your views

As we emerge from the recent heatwave, think forward to the wetter times of the year and to how wet and muddy some parts of the Cradhurst recreation ground can be. Is there something we could do about this?

The Westcott Village Association in conjunction with the Westcott 100 Club have started thinking about the challenge of improving access through the Cradhurst rec in all weathers particularly for users of wheelchairs and buggies.



This sketch shows a possible path layout – the exact route needs to be determined. The idea is to connect the existing entrances with a path (made from sustainable but hard-wearing materials) going around the main playing area.

Any work would be paid for by a combination of funds from the WVA, the Westcott 100 Club and other grant sources.

To be able to access these funding sources we need to demonstrate that there is a local need for this work, so this is where you come in.
