LOOKING BACKWARDS TO GO FORWARDS

Autumn seems to be a season of remembering.

We have just celebrated All Hallows' Eve – now better known as Halloween. This was historically a day to look back on the lives of those who have gone before. A day

to remember flawed human beings who had done their best to serve their fellow humans and their God.

Then comes 'Guy Fawkes Night'. "Remember, remember

the fifth of November, gunpowder, treason and plot..." (although, perhaps ironically, I can never recall the next line...). Now typically a chance to set off a few fireworks and to warm up around a bonfire, 'Gunpowder Treason Day' became the predominant English state commemoration in the 17th Century. In a reminder for how collective acts of remembering can be for ill as well as good, it sadly often became a focus of anti-Catholic sentiment.

The eleventh hour of the eleventh

day of the eleventh month marks the Armistice, the agreement to end the horrifying fighting of the First World War. Remembrance Day offers us a chance to pause for two minutes silence to remember those who for our tomorrow, gave their today. Do join us at Holy Trinity for Remembrance Sunday on November 13th as we mark this moment of national reflection together.

The Bible contains many calls for people to remember what has gone before. The good. The bad. The ugly. One regular practice involved

putting up large stones (perhaps not dissimilar to our practice of erecting war memorials) to remind people of key events, such as God rescuing his people from slavery in Egypt. This is the same loaic at the heart of the

act of communion where Christians the world over consume bread and wine as physical reminders of the presence and love of God as they remember Jesus' death and resurrection.

Remembering is important, but not for its own sake. As Churchill once observed, "Those that fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it." Or to put a more positive spin on why we need to remember, note the words of the Austro-Bohemian composer Gustav Mahler "Tradition is not the worship of ashes, but the preservation of fire."

What is true of music is true of life. Reflecting on what has been allows us to move forward, facing new challenges and seasons whilst holding on to what really matters.

We are delighted to have welcomed the Mid Surrey Community Fridge to Westcott in October. The Fridge aims to stop food waste by distributing food from supermarkets, restaurants, cafes and suppliers to local residents so the food is not wasted. Priority is given to those most in need but anyone is welcome, with donations encouraged if you can afford to.

The Mid Surrey Community Fridge is based in Dorking and has four fixed community fridges including two vans who visit local villages which now includes Westcott. You will now find them every Monday outside St John's at 1.30pm. Do spread the word and pop along and visit.



Another sustainable initiative being explored by the **WVA** is the potential



for some public use Electric Vehicle Charging Points in Westcott and also whether there is demand for a Community Car Club vehicle. These two initiatives are very exciting and could be developed using Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding. We would welcome your views and ideas on how to develop them further.



Staying with motoring, Surrey County Council have been consulting on proposals

reduce existing speed limits on rural areas within Mole Valley and across the County which are currently subject to derestricted speed limits. The proposals include changes to Loamore Lane and Westcott Heath which a number of residents and the WVA have raised concerns about. The worry is the proposed new speed limit of 20mph is mistaken for approval to drive at this speed where in reality "dead slow" is the only safe speed in several sections of these roads. Comments have been submitted as part of the Surrey consultation which closed on the 21st October.

THE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR WRITES...



Looking Back

With the days of a district councillor serving just our Westcott community now numbered (208 to go as I write this, not that I'm counting you understand), I thought that it might be interesting to look back ten years to see what I was writing to you about back then.




In November 2012, our village was just preparing to complete the Westcott Village

Forum survey and I was urging you to look out for it when it arrived at your door. More than 700 of us did just that and the survey results went on to form the core of the now adopted Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan that continues to shape our village for the generations to come.

Elsewhere my article covered another attempt to solve the traffic flow problems from Westcott to Dorking and a plug for the efforts of Transition Dorking. This was set in the context of my postbag dealing with consumer debt and the cost of living: Debt is also a frequent postbag topic and so in a week when the cost of winter fuel has

gone up again, you might like to know that Dorking Energy Group is looking for volunteers to form a Draught-Busting Hit Squad. Full training will be

provided to help a team draughtproof houses for people with cold homes in Dorking. If you'd like to help them please

That's probably a good reminder to us all, where possible and safe, to think about how we can more efficiently use our natural resources this winter and make the most of the money in our pockets. There are more ideas at https://www.surreycc.gov.uk/health-and-welfare/support and https://www.molevalley.gov.uk/goinggreen

But an overriding factor as we approach the depths of winter is that we must take care of each other as well. Please don't turn down or switch off your heating to a level where it puts your health at any risk. If you are worried about the cost of the fuel bills to that extent, then please speak to folks at the District Council (01306 885001) and they will signpost you to the most appropriate help for you personally.

Community Solar

Some of you may know that there has

been a planning application recently for a small array of solar panels to support a domestic property in the village. This got me thinking, and picking the brains of local folks who know this stuff better than I do, about how many solar panels there might be in our village already – and how many more we might need.



The average panel seems to max out at around 250-300W with the average domestic delivery through the year perhaps being closer to 100W, and Westcott's demand appears to be in the region of approaching 0.8-0.9MW. I am told, although the maths here seems to come in a number of flavours, that might mean that to power the village (or at least the equivalent of the village, with the appropriate battery storage facilities too) we might want around 3,000 modern panels in an four acre array.

This though could change significantly as we switch to electric vehicles – given that transport currently makes up nearly 90% of Westcott's direct carbon consumption.

If you are interested in seeing whether

there is more we could do collectively, as a community, to provide power for ourselves, then let me know or get in touch directly with the team at Green Westcott.

Supporting Local Businesses

Regular readers will know that this year I have the honour of being the Vice-Chairman of the Council. One of the responsibilities that comes with that role is to champion our district, its charities and businesses. A few weeks ago, my Consort and I were delighted to mark the first anniversary of the opening of TikkaNation, an Indian street food restaurant in Dorking High Street.



Like many local businesses, their story is one of a couple working more than one job to get the business going and employing local people, returning money to our rural economy. I am sure that this story is repeated up and down the streets of our town and its villages, including Westcott. It seemed an appropriate moment to remind us all to shop local and to support our local traders as they seek to support us all.

Energy Bill Scams

Action Fraud has received hundreds of crime reports relating to fake text messages purporting to be from the UK government. The texts state that the recipient is "owed" or "eligible" for an energy bill discount as part of the Energy Bill Support Scheme. The links in the emails lead to genuine-looking websites that are designed to steal your personal and financial information.



There is no need to apply for the Government's cost of living energy bill support and these texts are fake. But be aware that if you have an older prepayment meter you will get energy bill discount vouchers sent to you in the first week of each month from October, via SMS text, email or post, that you will then need to redeem at

your usual top-up point. In all cases, no household should be asked for bank details at any point.

• Spotted a suspicious text message? Forward it to 7726 (it's free of charge). If you forward a text to 7726, your provider can investigate the origin of the text and arrange to block or ban the sender, if it's found to be malicious.

Clearing out the Brownie cupboards some years ago, we came across the original registration certificate for 1st Westcott Brownies from Girlguiding Headquarters. It was dated 23rd November 1922, so, it with some confidence that we are able to celebrate the Pack's 100th birthday this month. So much has changed in 100 years, but our values remain, and we continue to promise to do our best, be true to ourselves and our beliefs, think of others before ourselves and serve our monarch, our country and our community.



Over the 15 years that I have been privileged to lead "The Best Brownie Pack in the World", we have also had LOADS of fun! From learning to cook over a campfire, planting

hanging baskets for the village, meeting World Record holders, dressing up as mummies, growing our own butterflies, making badges at WestFest, being 'pirates' on the River Thames, playing 'live' Hungry Hippos, being virtual Alice in Wonderland, to knocking on the door of 10 Downing Street (and running away!), sleepovers at Sealife and on HMS Belfast, and even waking up next to the lions at London Zoo! An intriguing programme will be presented by the unusually-named blz'art piano duo when they appear in a Dorking Concertgoers concert. The two Belgian pianists chose their name to reflect their unconventional approach and they enjoy exploring a wide variety of music, including some special arrangements for piano duet. Their programme includes music to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the birth of Ralph Vaughan Williams in October, together with music by Grieg, Grainger and Copland, and also Ravel's delightful Mother Goose Suite.

Dorking Philharmonia will also mark the Vaughan Williams anniversary by playing his fifth symphony, a beautiful and largely serene work that appeared in the middle of the second world war and was seen by many as providing solace in troubled times. Also on the programme is Beethoven's mighty fifth symphony.

Dorking Choral Society's concert will include one of Haydn's finest settings of the mass, written towards the end of his long life. The tickets are £18 in advance and will be £20 on the door.

Surrey Philharmonic Orchestra, playing in Ashtead, will perform Vaughan Williams's tuba concerto. This piece for a rather neglected instrument is now a standard of the tuba repertory, but is only rarely heard. The programme also includes Elgar's overture Froissart and Brahms's first symphony, seen as a clear successor to Beethoven when it was first performed.

December is of course the occasion for Christmas concerts. Coming up right at the beginning of the month are the Ladybirds choir, conducted by Helena Twentyman, on Dec 3rd at 3pm at the United Reformed church hall; and the Brockham choral society, also on Dec 3rd at 7.30 in St Martin's church. More details next time!

WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



Home Front Dorking in The First World War 1914-18 by Kathy Atherton

On 13 September we had an illustrated talk by Kathy Atherton (Chairman of Dorking Museum) about the 'Home Front Dorking in WW1 1914-18'. In 1914 Dorking was a quiet market town of some 8000 people, King George V had been on the throne since 1910 and the Prime Minister was the Liberal Herbert Asquith. On 28 June 1914 Archduke Ferdinand of Austria was assassinated by some Serbs and the European powers became very tense.

Kathy showed with her slides that life went on in the country side as it always had done - the Wotton Flower Show took place and the Dorkina horse drawn Fire Brigade was in action, children were at school and men were in the fields. On 26 July the Dorking Territorials marched to the station. accompanied by the town band, to set off for training on Salisbury Plain. The summer fair on Cotmandene took place. But Germany declared war on France on 4 Aug and invaded Belgium, so reluctantly Britain was at war with Germany and volunteers for the army were called up.

The owner of the popular haberdashery shop in Dorking called Degenhardt issued a notice to say he was not a German! The Abinger Relief Committee and the Dorking Relief Committee started relief funds to aid

families facing hardship as their men had gone to the war. More Dorking men set off to march to Guildford to join the county regiment - the Queens Regiment. Young men joined the army because they thought it was an adventure and they would be home by Christmas. Dorking Football Club cancelled its match fixtures for the next season and Norbury Park issued an advert for men and boys rejected by the local recruitment offices.

There was much controversy about whether conscription should be imposed but it was rejected. A variety of troops were billeted in Dorking including the Surrey Yeomanry (Queen Mary's Regiment). On 16 August the Government decided to form the BEF led by Field Marshall Sir John French to lead the defence of Belgium. Prime Minister Asquith appointed Field

Kitchener had ordered 2 million rifles and large amounts of other armaments and shells from America, but by mid 1915 a Ministry of Munitions was formed to organise munitions in Britain. After the heavy losses in the battle of Loos in Sept-Oct 1915, Field Marshall French was replaced by Sir Douglas Haig (1861-1928) who was supported by Kitchener.



Women began to take over the jobs normally carried

out by men both in agriculture and in industry particularly in armament factories. Women harvested the hay to feed the horses at Remount Depots in Redhill and in Europe. At this stage refugees were arriving from Belgium and wounded soldiers were returning. People were suffering from shortages of food - life was getting very serious.

In June 1915 an anti-aircraft warning system was installed in Dorking to warn against the arrival of Zeppelins bound for London. In August a mock exercise for the defence of London took place to prepare for the possibility of invasion, many aspects of which happened around Dorking and the North Downs. A PoW camp was established in Holmbury. In January 1916 the Dorking Tribunal established Military was and conscription was introduced. The Prime Minister's son, Raymond Asquith was killed on 15 Sept 1916 at the Battle of Fleurs Courcelette and his headstone is one of many often visited by the Battlefield Tour Groups. In June 1916 Kitchener set off in the cruiser HMS Hampshire to Archangel in northern Russia with a government delegation to negotiate supplies for the Russians with the Tsar, Nicholas 2, on the eastern front. But the ship was sunk by a stray German mine just west of Orkney and almost everyone on board was drowned.

The war became bogged down in attrition on both sides and ground to a halt with the armistice in November 1918. A notable result in Britain was the progress in women's suffrage with the Representation of People's Act in 1918 giving women over 30 the right to vote. The War Memorial in Holy Trinity Church has 36 names on it and the Dorking South Street Memorial has 365 names. The Westcott names are included in the Anniversary Book made by Peter Bennet and they can be found on the History Group website www.westcotthistory.org.uk.

There is no meeting in October and the next meeting will be on Tuesday 8th Nov at 8pm in St John's Hall. The lecture will be given by Sarah Slater -Secrets, Sex, Scandals and Salacious Gossip at the Royal Court in 1660-1830.



DORKING MUSEUM



The team at Dorking Museum was greatly saddened by the news of the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Some fondly recall her last visit to Dorking in 2004.

In the light of some discussion about why the Royal Train was not used to convey the late Queen back to London, our team did note that, in 1901, Queen Victoria's funeral train did pass through Holmwood, Capel and Dorking. It was of added local interest that the train did stop at Holmwood and the new King, Edward VII, together with the Emperor of Germany and Duke of York, alighted in order to send a telegram.

Hedgerow Heritage: This autumn the Museum is hosting an exhibition in conjunction with the Surrey Wildlife Trust's Hedgerow Heritage Project, an ambitious 4-year project aiming to restore and protect hedgerows across the North Downs Biodiversity Opportunity Area and to inspire and train a new generation of practical conservationists. Hedgerows are an essential part of our natural heritage and support a variety of plant and



animal species in cluding dormice, hedgehogs, bats, birds and butterflies. Since 1945, there has been a serious

decline in the number and condition of these essential habitats with their cultural, environmental and historic value. The exhibition explores the history and heritage of the area's hedgerows, their importance to the environment and community, and how they might be restored and renewed for the future.

This is a subject that would have been very close to the heart of one of the area's most notable residents. Last month saw the 150th anniversary of the birth



of the great British composer Ralph Vaughan Williams, whose pageant 'England's Pleasant Land' focused on the threats to the countryside and who later became Chairman and then President of the Dorking & Leith Hill Preservation Society (now the Dorking Society). The Museum was pleased to welcome Stephen Connock, Vice-President of The Ralph Vaughan Williams Society, initially researching RVW's activities in World War Two, but returning to present the Museum with a collection of signed and annotated original manuscripts and photographs. These will be prepared for a new display in the Museum.

Other recent additions: The Museum was presented by the Rotary Club of Dorking with a Presidents' Chain of Office that carries many well-known names from the Dorking business world

since the Club's foundation over 90 years ago. This will be displayed in the Museum beside the

Presidents' Chains of Dorking Round Table and of the Rotary Club of Dorking Deepdene.

Plans for a bandstand in Meadowbank Park, Dorking were recently approved by MVDC, and, in keeping with the town's heritage, the new structure will be a copy of the original Dorking bandstand which stood in South Street from 1922 to 1962. The golden Cockerel



that topped that is all that remains of the original and has recently been installed in the Museum.

The exquisite carefully researched cross-section model of the Mayflower and its contents, constructed by Dorking Men's Shed, was a popular centrepiece of the Museum's recent Darking 1620 exhibition and was retained on display. Better still, it now has sound! The Dorking Men's Shed have installed a motion sensor activated sound box to the model so that visitors will be able to hear the sounds of the sea and on board the ship as they view the model.

Oral histories: The past is about more than objects - it is about the human

experience. The Museum's oral history team was set up in 2017 to record personal memories and experiences of major events or of everyday life to keep them alive for us to understand better what life was like in this area in past times. Post covid, the team is now ready to begin interviewing again. We are looking to record memories of work and business, life in the area during WW2, or sports and pastimes, as well as looking for a volunteer who might lead an LGBTQI+ project. GREEN WESTCOTT



How Green is Your Death?



How much thought have you given to the impact your death will have on the environment?

It seems a little futile to spend a lifetime trying to reduce your carbon footprint, only to undo all the good you've done at the very last hurdle. There is there is no avoiding it so we might as well have a look at the options.

Cemeteries

In 2013, a BBC study found that a quarter of England's local authorities' cemeteries are expected to be full by 2023! (FT online 2019). Now that is frightening, so clearly something needs to be done. The main alternative to burial in this country is cremation with 75% of us choosing this way of departure.

How do the green credentials stack up? A straight-forward burial in a cemetery can often leave rather more in the ground than you may have bargained for. Metal hips and knees and silicon breast implants, everything goes into the ground contaminating the soil and filling it with foreign objects that will take millennia to decompose. Embalming is another harmful environmental element associated with burial.

What about natural burials?

Natural burials are definitely a better option but with land at a premium and Natural Burial grounds few and far between, this is not a cheap option. Truly green burial sites should insist that all 'unnatural' body parts (as mentioned above) are removed and that no embalming has taken place. They should also state that only decomposable and sustainably sourced coffins & liners are used (Natural Death Centre).

Coffins and Shrouds

Finding an environmentally friendly coffin is getting easier and there are now a number of green coffin makers on the market. Ranging from cardboard coffins, to those made of bamboo, reeds or even recycled wood. There are now a number of shroud makers creating beautiful and sometimes bespoke shrouds to be buried in. As with most bespoke items, these also come at an added cost that may not suit everyone's pocket.

So what about cremation?

The vast majority of people are now

using cremation as the go-to option for the end of their life, with a staggering 472,302 cremations in the UK in 2019. The cremation process is not without its unsustainable issues. The amount of CO2 released into the atmosphere during just one cremation, is the same as taking a flight from London to Rome! Obviously with the amount taking place on a daily basis this is not great, so what's the alternative? There are a couple, so read on.

Resomation

Resomation is basically a water cremation. I know it sounds a bit mad but that's pretty much what it is. Resomation founder Sandy Sullivan, states that "It [Resomation] has six times less carbon footprint and uses seven times less energy than traditional burial.

Human composting anyone?

One other option – although not currently available in the UK (come on UK pull your finger out!) is human composting! Recompose, an American company, were granted permission to begin human composting just

a few years ago. Natural Organic Reduction (NOR) is the process they use to turn bodies into compost. NOR uses an eighth of the energy needed compared to conventional burial and cremation, suggesting that this method, 'strengthens the environment rather than depleting it'. The body is rotated in a thin bed of beneficial microbes, which enables the transformation of the body, from solid matter into useful compost, in just 30 days.

The Resomation concept could most definitely be the way forward, providing both a low carbon footprint and offering nutrient-rich soil to replenish our earths' much depleted supply. If only we could get over ourselves and start to think differently about our own personal disposal, we might begin to entertain ideas that do some good for the Earth, not only while we are alive but even after our death. Now that really would be some legacy to leave behind!
