LENT - MAKING SPACE

We've been re-decorating my son's bedroom in the last few weeks, a task that has involved lots of cleaning, taking apart old furniture, removing unwanted stickers and posters, looking through magazines for inspiration for the new room, and an inevitable trip to IKEA for more flatpack furniture.

There's been a clearing out, an imagining what the new room will look like, and choosing furniture and pictures to make it a space he really wants to live in.

The question we've been asking as we've been redecorating our son's room is, "What do you want?" Thinking about it, this question could be not just for a room, but goes to the heart of all human life.

When we ask what we want, we're asking what we love, what has captured our imaginations and what we want to pursue. Whether this is a simple choice in a café or the big questions of life: who is our Valentine? What job? Where to live? the question "What do you want? What do you love?" is central to our

human lives.

I wonder if this clearing out, imagining and re-arranging a room is a good metaphor for the season of Lent? Lent traditionally begins with a 'clearing out' of both the home and the self. A 'clearing out' of the home by using up all dairy and eggs in making delicious pancakes on Pancake Day, and a 'clearing out' of the self by confessing wrongs and seeking forgiveness.

Then the season of Lent, a time of self-reflection and simplicity, begins.



Perhaps this Lent, we could take time to imagine our lives as a room – and consider the different 'items' that are in it. Which have we deliberately chosen, and which are in there by accident? Which do we welcome, and which are not helping us to live well? - What do we want?

Lent is an opportunity for us to pause and picture what living a flourishing life really looks like. An opportunity to re-imagine and deliberately choose what and who we want to make space for, what we want to pursue.

Hundreds of years ago, a Christian called Augustine was thinking about that question "What do you want?" and said of God, "You have made us for yourself, and our hearts are

restless until they find their rest in you." In knowing God, he said, we can find what we truly want - real rest, flourishing life. I have found these words to be true in my own life. Perhaps there is wisdom there for each of us, as we choose what to let go of and what to keep, as we ask ourselves "What do you want?"

Plenty going on as usual so here is a quick round up of local and village news to keep you in the loop.

Future Mole Valley (Local Plan)



December In MVDC surprised people, including the HM Planning Inspector who has spent most of 2022 conducting the

public independent examination of the draft Local Plan, by announcing they were 'pausing' the process.

They have subsequently clarified this and explained it is to allow them to take account of any proposed changes by the Government to the National Planning Policy these changes are currently out for consultation. The result of this consultation mav brina changes to the way Local Plans are developed including housing targets and their significance, as well as the use of Green Belt for development.

Highways

We spotted a few weeks ago that sadly several road signs had been vandalised on the same between Dorkina and Westcott. Using the on-line Surrey County Council 'Report a Highways Issue' portal we were able to quickly bring these to Surrey Highways attention who have acknowledged the issue and confirmed they will reinstate the signs shortly.

With potholes and other highways issues increasina problem at



this time of year we urge residents to use this on-line portal to report any problems as it ensures the issue is recorded and followed up by the relevant body. A link to the Report a Problem pages can be found on the Westcott Village website and having used it several times we know



Westcott 100 Club

February is a quiet month for the Westcott 100 Club as we prepare for the Annual General Meeting and next draw in March, so now may be a good time to remind readers of what the Westcott 100 Club is and how it works.

We are a 'Small Society Lottery' where members subscribe to a number of 'tickets' at £25 each per year. These tickets are entered into four quarterly draws (in March, June, September and December) where there are two prizes per draw. There is an additional annual draw each December where there is a single, bigger prize. Overall, the scheme gives back 40% of its subscriptions to members as prizes, with the remaining 60% available for projects around the village. We distributed over £1200 in prizes in 2022 and have accumulated a grant fund of over £5000 ready and waiting to allocate to projects.

The scheme remains open for new members and for existing members to increase their number of tickets. We are limited to a maximum of 200 tickets overall (currently membership stands at 110 so there are 90 more tickets available). Individual members may hold up to 20 each.

Community Leadership

Counting down the days to the end of our village having a dedicated District Councillor raises the theme of effective community leadership. The huge number of leaders that we have in our community serve us in myriad ways – from running community groups, providing education, entertainment and/or employment and also in helping individuals and families to meet their own needs for example – a home or a meal.

As well as remembering to thank each and every one of these leaders, part of the role of District Councillor is to listen to the emerging and changing themes of what those needs are and to challenge and champion the community to meet those needs. Time and again recently I have heard people tell me that Westcott needs more affordable homes and more

parking. The District Council does have a small pot of money that developers provide for creating new affordable homes but often villages like ours miss out because sites are not proposed by the community for such new homes.



If you know of a site in the village that could provide new affordable homes and parking then please raise its profile – I will happily put you in touch with the Council Officer team that look after these opportunities.

Highways and Road Safety



Judging by my records, I seem to average reporting about four highways or countryside

maintenance issues to our councils

everv month about that's 700 since I became a councillor. These range from blocked drains fallen to footpath signs, from potholes to overgrown



pavements and are usually inspected and resolved reasonably quickly.

Recently I came across a burnt out vehicle that had been left in the woods west of the village. This obviously causes danger to



passing wildlife and to children that might be out with parents. It's more that simple anti-social behaviour. In this instance the Council team and the landowner also have the challenge not to contaminate the land as they recover the vehicle – all at the expense of the taxpayer.



You will have also noticed that across a couple of occasions in the run qu to Christmas and New Year about a dozen of the road

signs between Westcott and Dorking were vandalised. Many of these signs are hazard warning ones and their absence therefore increases the risks to drivers and pedestrians.

Two things are clear to me though. Firstly, someone in the village, someone reading this article, knows who caused the damage to these signs and/or drove that car into the woods. Secondly, whoever is causing this damage needs some help, at least

A Final Thought

Someone in the village recently asked me to be more political in these articles and make clear my views on Council decisions.

I thought that I would end this month's article by explaining why I, and my predecessor, have never done that. Yes – raise issues but do so in a way that helps readers to

connect with them in the way that suits their own position, beliefs and circumstances. District Councillors are here to serve everyone irrespective of how they vote in the democratic process – or indeed if they choose not to vote at all.

This year I have had the pleasure of being the Vice-Chairman of Mole Valley District Council, a position I was elected to on a non-party basis by colleagues from across the Council Chamber. It is a non-political but honoured role and the opportunity to focus my time on championing our communities and businesses has been extremely rewarding (supported by my ever serving Consort I should add).



MUSIC IN DORKING



12th at 3.00, Carducci string quartet at Dorking Halls, £21, 01306 740619 25th at 7.30, Surrey Philharmonic Orchestra at St George's church, Ashtead

In February the Carducci string quartet gives the first of three concerts arranged by the Dorking Concertgoers Society. Their programme begins with a quartet by the father of the string quartet, Joseph Haydn, known by its nickname of *The Joke* (you'll find out why!), and it finishes with one of Beethoven's last quartets, the impressive op. 127 in E flat. The centrepiece is a quartet by Fanny Mendelssohn. She, as well as being the sister of Felix Mendelssohn, was a fine musician in her own right and a prolific composer whose music is now being more widely played and heard. Please note this is an afternoon concert starting at 3pm.

The Surrey Philharmonic Orchestra, playing in Ashtead, opens with Fauré's exquisite short *Pavane*, and follows this with the first cello concerto of Saint-Saëns, a charming and elegant work, with Leo Popplewell as the soloist. The concert concludes with Beethoven's *Symphony No. 4*, a fine piece that is less often heard than it deserves.

The Dorking Halls presents a live screening from the Royal Opera House of Rossini's hilarious comic opera *The Barber of Seville* on Feb 15th.

WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



Monument to Bishop Samuel Wilberforce on Abinger Roughs



Many people who walk their dogs on Abinger Roughs will have seen this monument to Bishop Samuel Wilberforce (1803-1873)

who fell off his horse on 19th July 1873 while riding with Lord Granville to visit Gladstone at Holmbury St Mary.

He was born at Clapham Common, the 5th child of William Wilberforce and Barbara Spooner, the major campaigner against slavery and the slave trade. He was known as 'Soapy Sam' due to his characteristic handwashing when he was giving speeches. He was one of the great speakers of his day and is remembered for his speech in opposition to Charles Darwin's Theory at a debate in 1860.

He had an Anglican education outside of English public schools, as chosen by his father William. In 1823 Samuel entered Oriel College, Oxford where he met William Gladstone and graduated in 1826, aged 23, taking a 1st in Mathematics and a 2nd in Classics. In 1827 he toured the continent and married Emily Sargent,

daughter of the Rector of East Lavington in West Sussex in 1828.

He was ordained as a deacon in the Church of England and became a curate at Checkenden near Henley on Thames. Thence followed rapid progress to Archdeacon of

Surrey, Chaplain to Prince Albert and Queen Victoria and appointment as Dean of Westminster. Robert Peel appointed him Bishop of Oxford and he was elected to the FRS (Fellow of Royal Society).

After 24 years at Oxford he was translated by Gladstone, the PM, to be the Bishop of Winchester in 1869. He was a 'high Tory' and a supporter of Catholic emancipation. Although he was very successful, he had his detractors. Benjamin Disraeli commented that he was unctuous, oleaginous and saponaceous!





WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP (cont.)



Although Samuel was certainly a supporter of the campaign against slavery in the British Empire it was his father, William, who had done the work to get the legislation passed in Parliament. Samuel's friend Gladstone's father was one of the biggest slave owners. William was born in Hull into a prosperous Yorkshire merchant family.



William Wilberforce

William Wilberforce (August 1754 -29th July 1833) became an Independent MP for Yorkshire (1784-1812) during the reign

of George III. In 1787 he and his friend Thomas Clarkson became the leading British abolitionists in the parliamentary campaign against the British participation in slave trading for some 20 years until the Slave Trade Act of 1807 became law – it was actually passed in 1804 but the pace of administration took so long.

William and Thomas Clarkson were convinced of the importance of religion, morality and education. He supported British Missionary work in India and the creation of the free colony of Sierra Leone. He founded the CMS (Church Missionary Society)

and the SPCA (Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals) among others, including the RSPCA in 1824 and the RNLI, earlier known as the National Institution for Preservation of Life from Shipwreck.

He was very generous with his time and his money, giving away thousands of pounds. He was a somewhat deferential character and despite strong opposition continued the campaign against slavery and in the process wore himself out and became much poorer. News of slave unrest in Jamaica and the French islands was reaching Britain from 1827, culminating in the Jamaican Slave Rebellion in 1831 and this probably convinced those opposing MP's that the time for arguing was up. The Slavery Abolition Act was passed in 1833 by the Whig government (283 votes to 16) and abolished slavery in the British Empire. William died three days after the Act was passed.

The Act affected 800,000 slaves and included £20 million in compensation to the plantation owners, full emancipation for those under 6 and apprenticeship schemes for others, to be run by the plantations. William Wilberforce and his friends won a long battle for the cause of abolition.


Of course, this mostly comes from within and their amazing caring parents and significant adults in their lives, but the privilege we have of supporting them as educators is something that re-energises me daily.

Dorking dinosaur 40th anniversary event: The show must go on! We are grateful to Dorking Library for hosting our half-term family event on **Tuesday 14th February, 2pm-5pm**. 2023 marks 40 years since the discovery of Dorking's most famous dinosaur, the Baryonyx. When its giant claw was unearthed by sharp-eyed fossil hunter Bill Walker in 1983, it created a worldwide sensation because the dinosaur was completely unknown to science.



Today, the original skeleton is in the Natural History Museum and Baryonyx

(meaning 'heavy claw') even featured in a Jurassic World movie. Sadly, Bill died over the summer, though he was given scientific immortality when the dinosaur was named Baryonyx walkeri in his honour.

Come to the Library to see the story of the discovery of the Baryonyx, a



life-size replica of the giant claw, models to show what the dinosaur would have looked like as it prowled

the dinosaur swamp and items on loan from Bill's family including the original rock hammer that prised it out of the ground. Meet our young fossil enthusiast, Charlie, with some of his amazing collection of fossils and dino-

bones. There will also be dinosaur art and craft activities and children will be invited to take part in the creation of a large Baryonyx artwork for the library wall!

Winter Thrushes

Blackbirds (both black males and dark brown females) hop across our lawns and song thrushes feed close to the shelter of the shrubs and hedges throughout the year. In winter, three further thrush species that breed in the northern regions of Europe and come south around October add to the variety of local wildlife.



Redwing

Redwings love to forage in flocks. This is our smallest thrush, with rich brown backs, red under their wings (seen as they fly) and an eye stripe. Often seen along hedgerows, especially those with fruit, they venture further into open ground than the slightly larger song thrush.

Fieldfares arrive a little later than the redwings, in flocks that move across the countryside like an invading army. A party has stripped the holly bushes in my garden of all their berries in a single day. These are large birds with

grey backs. Their flight pattern looks remarkably uncoordinated for a species that migrates long distances. When disturbed, they often fly up into the nearest treetops.

Mistle thrushes may be resident or winter migrants, but never appear in large numbers. Large birds, they are greyer than song thrushes with



a different pattern of spots on the breast. They prefer quieter areas with open spaces as well as shrubbery. Each establishes a territory with a food supply (holly bushes are favourites) which is strenuously defended from others. They sing from the very tops of trees, chimney pots or TV aerials. The old name 'stormcock' was given as they often continue to sing in wind and rain.

Next time you see "thrushes" in garden or field, look carefully at colour and behaviour to work out which of these family members you are enjoying.

come running towards us as soon as they hear the car pull into the car park.



GREEN WESTCOTT



The Power of Caring

In a dominant culture where the interests of the individual have been promoted above that of the common good and the mainstream media continuously feeds judgement and division, the power of caring, to bring much-needed change, should not be underestimated. Care can be a radical act. It can challenge the status quo.



Compassion calls us to treat other people in the way that we would wish to be treated ourselves. Whereas judgement can bring separation and condemnation, practicing compassion can bring recognition of our interconnectedness - our dependence upon one another - and healing.

Liz Grant, Professor of Global Health and Development at Usher Institute, describes compassion as a four-part process: 'noticing pain and suffering, interpreting the suffering, feeling empathic concern or sadness, and acting to alleviate this suffering in some way.'
